## Reopening businesses safely

- Safety for employees and guests is key. The Texas Department of State Health offers
   <u>guidance on safety measures</u> when opening businesses, including downloadable PDFs
   regarding minimum recommended health protocols for different types of businesses,
   workers and public places.
- The <u>Dallas Regional Chamber</u> also offers online health and safety information for all businesses as well as specific industries, such as manufacturing, construction and retail.
- Target offers a comprehensive online guide specifically developed for resources, complete
  with templates such as store signage, overhead announcements and other communications
  pieces for employees and guests.

## Helping those most impacted by COVID-19

- Recent media reports have focused on how existing health disparities can impact incidence and prevalence of COVID-19 in areas of Dallas County.
- In order to help improve testing and education in areas hardest hit by COVID, Parkland added testing to seven of its community-based primary care clinics. Find all area <u>testing</u> <u>locations</u> on the Parkland website, including testing for Parkland patients, any Dallas County resident or any site across Texas.
- Testing for any Dallas County resident is available at no cost at 9191 S. Polk Street (Ellis
  Davis Field House) and 2500 Victory Plaza (American Airlines Center), daily from 8 a.m. to 5
  p.m. or until maximum number of tests is reached.

### New county orders to keep residents safe

- Dallas County clarified <u>procedures for long-term care facilities</u>, such as nursing homes, regarding notification of residents and families when a positive COVID-19 case is discovered as well as procedure for additional testing within the facility if there should be a new positive case.
- Dallas County also set <u>safety requirements for food processing facilities</u>.
